

IN MEMORIAM



PATRICK JOSEPH RYAN — OCTOBER 10, 1920 - SEPTEMBER 29, 2023

Patrick Joseph Ryan passed away peacefully at the age of 102. Born in Kilmogue, County Kilkenny, Ireland to his parents Michael and Catherine Ryan. Patrick was predeceased by his wife, Anastasia Ryan. He is survived by his children, Michael Ryan (Kathy), Katheen Pallas (William), James Ryan (Carol), Mary Baireuther (John), and Patrick Ryan; siblings, the late John, Laurence, Denis, Geoffry, and Michael; grandchildren, the late Michael Ryan Jr., Christen Ryan, Matthew Pallas (Nora), and Anastasia Wilson (Daniel); great-grandson Francis Pallas; and many nieces and nephews located in Canada, France, Ireland, and England.

Pat emigrated to San Francisco in 1958, with his wife Anastasia (nee O'Reilly)(RIP), and four of his kids who were born in Ireland-Michael, Kathleen, Jim and Mary-with youngest child Patrick arriving shortly after they had settled locally. That same year, Pat joined Local Carpenters Union

#22 and until 1964 worked for several local Irish contractors building homes. Answering the call to volunteer one weekend from his Local 22 Union, at the Sisters of the Good Shepherd campus in the Portola district, Pat ended up securing a full-time position with the Sisters and worked there between 1964 until his retirement in 1988. Since his retirement he volunteered with the Sisters on various new building projects, remodels, repairs and even has organized gardening days where he involved several of his close friends.

Pat also enjoys working and tinkering with old clocks. I interviewed Pat back in 2020 around the time he celebrated his 100th Birthday, and he told me "my front living room is full of clocks." He enjoyed estate sales in the neighborhood, growing orchids as a hobby and in pre-pandemic times hosted monthly 25 card games for fun in his home. This author spent many nights around the kitchen table playing games into the wee hours of the next day! There was always lots to eat and libations plentiful. He was a most gracious host always, just like the game of house cards in the "old country".

Sheila (Maurice Pats) Brosnan passed away peacefully in her home, surrounded by family, on September 30, 2023. She is now reunited with her husband, Pat Brosnan. She is survived by her daughter, Noreen Murphy (Daniel); son, Patrick "Kerry" Brosnan (Carol); grandchildren: Gavin (Fahmida), Sarah, Julie (Justin) Murphy, Clare and Mary (James) Brosnan, great-granddaughter, Emma Murphy; and numerous nieces and nephews both here and in Ireland. She is preceded in death by her sisters, Bridget and Joan; and her brothers: Pat, Tim, Mossie and John.

Sheila was born in Killeentierna, Co. Kerry, the sixth child of Maurice and Julia Brosnan's seven children. After her mother's death, Maurice married Mary Griffin and Sheila was blessed with two more brothers, Dennis and Neil. At 17, she immigrated to the US and made a second home in San Francisco's Mission District and though she didn't know it at the time, moved in next door to her

future sister-in-law. She could often be found dancing at Knights of the Red Branch or traveling with friends and family. She always considered Ireland her true home and made sure to travel back every summer. When in the States, she

kept Ireland with her, as she served on the board of the UICC, helped run the San Francisco Rose of Tralee Pageant, founded the JFK Girls Pipe Band, and was the first woman to serve as chairperson for the Kerry Club. Later in life, she found daily joy weeding the gardens at the house Pat built in Forestville and baking pies with apples and blackberries picked with her grandchildren. Most days she did so with a song on her lips.

GAEILGE GASTRONOMY: A JOURNEY THROUGH IRELAND'S NATIVE TONGUE WITH BREAD AND BUTTER

Irish born writer and documentary maker Manachán Magan presented two sold out shows for his theatrical performance, "Arán & Im," (Bread and Butter) here at the Irish Center in early October. The show was a very unique and engaging experience that celebrated the Irish language, the natural landscape, and Irish food.

During the performance, Manachán baked sourdough bread for 70 minutes, which provided a sensory and interactive element to the event. As he baked the bread, he shared insights into the Irish language, highlighting potent words related to the landscape and phrases that evoke the beauty of the natural world. Much of what Manachán delivered was first hand knowledge of "old Irish words" gleaned from the "old timers" that are often overlooked in academic books. This added an educational and cultural dimension to the event.

The incorporation of freshly-baked bread and butter churned from Irish cream was a lovely touch, connecting the audience with local Irish food traditions. It not only provided a taste of Ireland but also a hands-on experience by allowing the audience to slice the bread and churn their own butter, making the event more immersive.

Overall, "Arán & Im" was a wonderful blend of culture, language, and culinary traditions, making it a rich and memorable experience for those in attendance. Manachán Magan's combination of language and food is a creative and innovative way to celebrate Irish heritage.


