FOSTERING IRISH HERITAGE: ENRICHING EXPERIENCES AND MUSICAL MILESTONES

During the past month, I have been fortunate to witness and participate in a diverse range of programs hosted at the Center. These programs have received an overwhelmingly positive response and active involvement from various members of the Irish American community. While our current facility may have limitations, the signs are clear that a larger building would enable us to offer a wider variety of programs, enhance participation, and cater to the needs of all sections within our community.

Irish Summer Camp Success — Our highly anticipated 2023 Irish Camp commenced on Monday, June 12th, and concluded on June 30th, marking three weeks filled with enriching experiences and exciting discoveries. First established in 2021 with 30 campers, the camp

has now grown to 75 kids in 2023. Led by the talented Máire Clerkin and supported by a dedicated team of instructors, and assistants, our campers delved into a diverse range of Irish arts, physical activities, and even computer coding. The kids even got to try Gaelic football and hurling this year. Throughout their journey, they not only developed new skills and passions but also formed lasting friendships. The grand finale of the Camp took place on Friday, June 30th, where the campers' collaborative efforts were showcased in a mesmerizing performance titled "Tír na nÓg."

Emerging Irish Musicians — The ongoing music classes in fiddle, tin whistle, banjo, and bagpipes are demonstrating clear indications that our commitment to music education is poised to yield remarkable results in the future. Each week, students in these classes immerse themselves in the rich traditions of Irish music, honing their skills and nurturing their passion.

Among the talented participants, our young pipers have an exciting milestone to look forward to in July. After devoting a year and a half to mastering the intricacies of chanters, they will finally have the opportunity to graduate to playing real bagpipes. This significant progression marks a significant accomplishment in their musical journey, showcasing their dedication and perseverance.

By investing in music education and providing a platform for young musicians to flourish, we are sowing the seeds for a vibrant future filled with the enchanting melodies of Irish music. With each passing week, these emerging talents are cultivating their artistic abilities and embracing the rich cultural heritage of Ireland.

As we witness their growth and development, we are confident that these passionate individuals will go on to become accomplished Irish musicians, contributing to the legacy of Irish music and delighting audiences both near and far.

Belfast Photographic Exhibition — We had the privilege of supporting and promoting Sean McKernan's powerful exhibition, "Belfast: Conflict to Peace," which offered a captivating visual journey through the tumultuous history of the city from 1969 to 2023. Over the course of five days, the exhibition drew an appreciative audience, leaving a lasting impact on all who attended.

The opening night of the exhibition was a resounding success, attracting over 80 attendees. McKernan, a talented photographer hailing from Belfast himself, provided a firsthand account of life in his native city over the past four decades. His collection of photographs, taken from a bipartisan approach to documentary photography, served as a testament to the resilience and strength of the Belfast community.

One of the highlights of the exhibition was the formal talk held on Sunday, June 25th. McKernan captivated the audience with his enthralling narratives and stunning visuals. Through his photographs, he vividly

depicted the various stages of Belfast's transformation, shedding light on the struggles, the pain, and ultimately, the path towards reconciliation and peace.

From the early years of the Troubles, marked by violence and division, to the gradual efforts towards peace and reconciliation, Sean's photographs painted a powerful picture of Belfast's journey. Each image told a story, capturing the emotions, the resilience, and the hopes of a community torn by conflict but determined to heal its wounds.

Through McKernan's lens, we were able to witness the impact of the Good Friday Agreement in 1998, which laid the foundation for peace and political stability in Northern Ireland. The photographs showcased the gradual healing of the city, the rebuilding of shattered neighborhoods, and the fostering of cross-community relationships. They reminded us that despite the scars of the past, Belfast has emerged as a symbol of resilience, unity, and the power of reconciliation.

The exhibition served as a testament to the importance of acknowledging and understanding the history of conflict and reconciliation in Belfast. It highlighted the need for continued efforts to foster understanding, promote dialogue, and support initiatives that contribute to a lasting peace. Greetings from the Library














2023 Summer Camp Director

MARGARET "MARGE" HAGAN — SEPTEMBER 25, 1936 - JUNE 12, 2023



Sincere sympathy to the family and friends of Marge Hagan from all of us here at the Irish Center. With Marge's passing we have lost a connection to the original Board of Directors as Marge husband Conn (RIP) was on the first UICC Board when the facility opened in 1975.

Marge grew up in the Mission District of San Francisco she attended St. John's grammar school and St. John's High School where she met many life long friends. Marge went onto work for Met Life for several years before meeting the love of her life. Marge met Conn Hagan and they were married in St. Paul's Church on June 2, 1962. Their son Frank was born in 1963 and Marge and Conn moved to Holy Name Parish where they met their life long friends and next-door neighbors of 60 years Barbara and Tom O'Brien. Thanks to Barbara, Marge was introduced to See's Candies, which created a life long bond between the two of them.

Marge dedicated her life to Conn, Frank and all of her family. Family was Marge's entire world, and

she loved spending time with Conn, Frank, Kerry, Connor& Daniel. She loved attending the boys games & many family parties.

She was a volunteer librarian at Holy Name School for many years, a den mother for the local Cub Scout group, volunteering countless hours on fundraisers assisting people in need. If you asked her for a loaf of Irish Soda Bread for a party, you got 8 loaves.

As a founding member of the United Cultural Center she spent countless enjoyable hours managing the 32/50 Club, which she would proudly say, paid off the mortgage on the Irish Center.

Very dear to Marge's heart was her time spent volunteering at San Francisco General Hospital with her partner in crime Dolly Simmons. Due to a severe illness that forced her to spend a year in the hospital as a young woman, Marge always had a soft spot in her heart for people who were lonely and lost in the hospital. As a result of her 40 years as a volunteer, Marge was awarded the Hero's and Hearts award in 2007 for her dedication & volunteerism to SFGH.

Marge will be missed by her loving family and friends. She is survived by her son Frank (Kerry) her grandson's Connor (Haley Barker) and Daniel Hagan, her brother Frank (Wendy) Jordan, her in-laws Jim Hagan, Bill (Lily) Hagan, Anne Hagan, Elizabeth O'Hagan, Peggy Hagan, Maureen & Michael Murphy and many loving nieces and nephews. Marge was preceded in death by her loving husband Conn and her cherished brother and sister in-law Jack & Patsy Jordan.




