men nominally under his command, collected in the depot at Market Street. About 9 o'clock when Robert Emmet was beginning to reflect on the failure of all his preparations which turned out to be a false one. Then it was that he determined to leave the depot and go into the street rather than wait to be cooped up with his followers and massacred on form. He gave orders to distribute the arms, and after sending up a single rocket, called into Thomas Street with about eighty men, who were joined there by about as many more. He ran down Patrick Street and the Cornhill, crying out: "I am here, turn out!" but no one came out. He was attacked by some soldiers on the Cornhill but got off. They ran down Patrick Street and next night, about 11 o'clock, he fled to the mountains. Anne Devlin got horses and taken before a magistrate. She was threatened with death, bayonets thrust into her body, and a rope placed about her neck, by which she was raised in the air, to force her to tell the hiding place of Emmet and Mr. Ellis, but all to no purpose.
One day the Doctor came and spoke to her in a very good natured way, and said she must have some indulgence; she must be permitted to take exercise in the park. The yard door was closed the first person she met was Emmet to her. She was a close prisoner in Kilmainham, when taken from jail, through Thomas Street to the Castle, to be executed. The day after the execution she was examined. The latter had given orders to stop the coach at the scaffold where Emmet was executed, and she was forced to look at his blood.
When Robert Emmet alighted from the carriage, and was led to the foot of the scaffold with his arms tied, he mounted quickly and with apparent alacrity. In the few words he spoke on the scaffold he avoided any reference to political matters. He addressed the crowd in a firm and manly voice. He said: "My friends, I die in peace and with sentiments of universal love and kindness to all men." He then shook hands with some on the platform and removed his stock. He assisted in adjusting the rope around his neck. After standing on the plank for a few seconds, the executioner said: "Are you ready?" Emmet was heard to say: "Ready." No ready was given, and the question was repeated, and again Robert Emmet said: "Ready." A third time the word "Ready" was only heard, and the executioner lifted the plank, and a human being, young, generous, with gentle, patriotic, a few words of freedom and of justice, was hurled like a dog. At the expiration of the usual time the body was taken down as a specimen severed from the body by the hair and paraded along the front of the gallows by the hangman, proclaiming: "This is the head of a traitor, Robert Emmet."

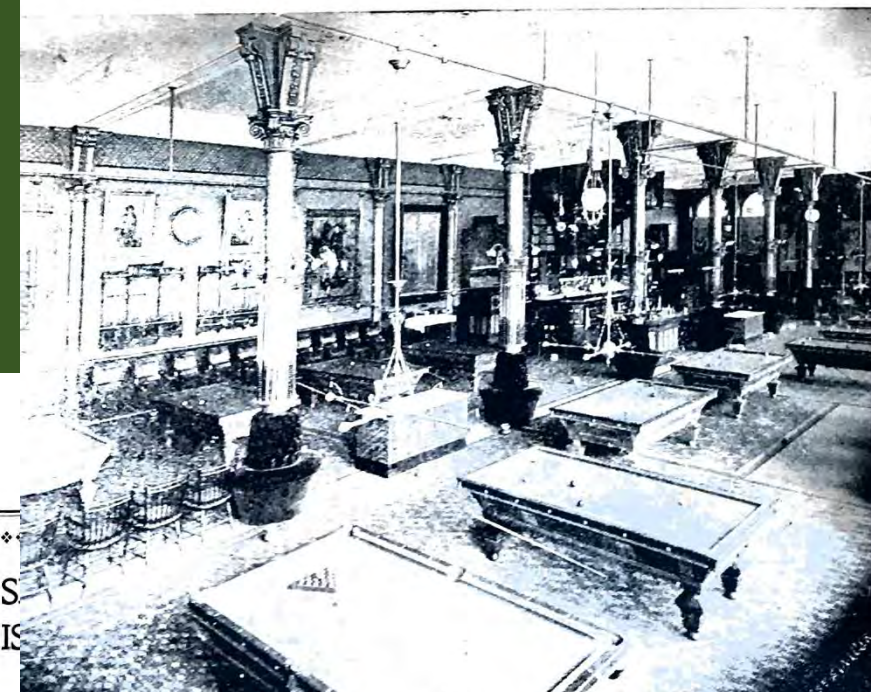
