BOARD MESSAGE

Irish American Heritage Month Celebrated with Success in California



March 2024 marked a significant achievement for Irish Americans as California joined in honoring Irish American Heritage Month, following a proclamation by President Joe Biden at the White House. This declaration was reinforced within the state by the passing of California Assembly Concurrent Resolution 149 at the state Capitol in Sacramento on March 14th.

State Capitol Visit — The atmosphere at the state capitol was charged with pride as supporters of the measure, including Consul General Micheál Smith, Vice-Consul

Jennifer Chadwick and visiting Irish Senator Jerry Buttimer, UICC board members Leo Cassidy and Redmond Lyons, gathered to witness the resolution's journey through both the California State Senate and Assembly. With resounding bipartisan support, the resolution was met with enthusiasm and approval from lawmakers in both chambers.

Assembly Members James Gallagher, Lisa Calderon, Damon Connolly, Heath Flora, and Matt Haney introduced the resolution in the Assembly, while Senate Bill was championed by Mike McGuire, the Pro Tempore leader of the California State Senate.

Century of Relations — The resolution, jointly passed by both houses, commemorates the I00th anniversary of diplomatic relations between the United States and Ireland. It also highlighted the significant contributions of Irish Americans to the country and the state of California, emphasizing the importance of celebrating Irish American Heritage Month throughout March, with particular emphasis on St. Patrick's Day.

In a statement, the legislature declared, "Everyone's Irish on St. Patrick's Day," underscoring the inclusive spirit of the celebration. The resolution further directed the Chief Clerk of the Assembly to transmit copies to key figures including Ireland's Ambassador to the United States, Geraldine Byrne Nason, and other dignitaries.

Reflecting on being present for the historic occasion, you could feel a great sense of pride and accomplishment resonating among attendees. I thought to myself "Wow!" Here we are in the political halls of power in the fifth largest economy in the world, taking center stage, which encapsulated the significance of the moment for me.

Concurrent Resolution 149 — The successful passage of California Assembly Concurrent Resolution 149 not only recognizes the vibrant heritage of Irish Americans but also underscores

the state's commitment to honoring and celebrating cultural diversity. As Irish American Heritage Month concludes, its impact on fostering unity and appreciation for diverse cultural contributions remains palpable across California.

Irish American Success Story — While walking the halls of the state capitol building, I couldn't help but marvel at the prominence of Irish Americans on this stage. Their journey, rooted in the waves of immigrants who sought refuge from famine, pursued economic opportunities, and escaped political upheaval, has woven a tapestry of pride in their Irish ancestry. John Downey was the first foreign born Irish governor of California (1860-1862) and more recent Irish American governors with Emerald Isle heritage include Edmund Brown (1959-1967) and his son Gerry Brown (2011-2019) and current Governor Gavin Newsom (2019-2024). Through the annals of history, Irish Americans have wielded significant influence, shaping the very essence of American society across realms of culture, politics, business, and beyond. This narrative persists to this day.

Preservation of Irish Culture — At the heart of this pride lies a steadfast commitment to preserving and celebrating Irish traditions. From the toe tapping beats of traditional music to the spirited movements of dance (there was Irish dancing through the halls of the State Assembly on March

THE UICC TOOK CENTER STAGE AT A CROSSROADS FESTIVAL PANEL DISCUSSION

Great to welcome guests curious about the history of Irish arts and culture community organizations in the San Francisco Bay Area to a special Irish American Crossroads event held at the UICC on Sunday, March 10 as their 2024 festival kicks off.

The panel talk, entitled-Preservation and Innovation: Irish and Irish-American Arts, Culture and History in the San Francisco Bay Area-gathered leaders of local prominent Irish arts and culture organizations to speak about their motivations and future visions for the work of their respective organizations. Participants included Tony Bucher, President of the Irish Literary and Historical Society and Columnist for the Irish Herald; Anne Cassidy Carew, Vice President of the United Irish Cultural Center, Co-Chair, Keepers of the Steps Program; and Eileen Mize, Co-

Chair of Keepers of the Steps Program, Marketing Team Member of the United Irish Cultural Center. Unfortunately, Catherine Barry, Founder/Director of Irish Culture Bay Area, Board member of SF Irish Film, Co-Director of the Irish Oral History Archive of the San Francisco Bay Area as well as Susan Keith, Chair, Comhaltas Ceoltóiri Éireann, Cooley-Keegan Branch were unable to attend as previously planned due to illness.

Anne Cassidy Carew gave a wonderful overview of all the programming at the UICC stressing the wide array of offerings and commitment to cultural preservation. She cited past leaders and members, such as her own late father Gerry Cassidy, as being the "giants upon whose shoulders we stand" especially as the Center embarks on a major capital campaign and building project that will provide space for the growth in programs and events that serve the greater Bay Area community.

Eileen Mize spoke about the origins and development of the Keepers of the Steps program—one of the cultural programs of the UICC that is near and dear to Eileen. She refers to her efforts in the history and preservation of Irish Dance in the San Francisco Bay Area as a "passion project" and credits her early interest to her own dance teacher and longtime friend Annie McBride. Eileen talked about the current exhibition at the San Francisco Historical Society which opened on February 29 and will be on display through May as well as some exciting future plans.

Thanks to Crossroads Director Margaret McPeake for organizing such a unique chance to engage in a vital discussion, and as she concluded the panel — "This may well be Part I of an on-going discussion."






Alcatraz Ghost Story Published



PATRICK O'SULLIVAN

November 24, 1931 ~ March 5, 2024



Patrick passed away peacefully on March 5, 2024, surrounded by his loving family. Pat was a loving husband to Eileen O'Sullivan (predeceased) for 60 years and an adored father of Margaret and Dennis O'Sullivan (predeceased).

Patrick had 20 siblings and he is predeceased by 19 of them. He was fond of saying that he was one of 21. He is survived by his sister, Theresa Kelleher from Millstreet, Co. Cork, Ireland and numerous nephews and nieces throughout the United States and Ireland.

He was born on November 24, 1931, on a farm on Claragthlea Mountain, Millstreet, County Cork. Ireland. After secondary school, he served his apprenticeship training as an auto mechanic in Coleman's Garage, Millstreet. Upon successful completion of the program, he embarked on his journey to the United States. In 1955 he immigrated to San Francisco where he had two sisters: Eileen Villalobos and Joan O'Sullivan McSweeny and a third sister, Sheila Becker, in Detroit, Michigan. In 1958, he married the love of his life Eileen McCarthy from Dunmanway, West Cork, Ireland. He met her at a dance

in Millstreet where she worked as a registered nurse and midwife.

While Pat continued his profession as an auto mechanic, he remained passionate about helping others. He fixed many a friends' car when needed and you could often hear the Irish laughter amongst his friends as he was fixing their car in his driveway. Pat and Eileen raised their two children in the sunset district of San Francisco where they lived for the remainder of their lives.

Pat enjoyed all things Irish and was very proud of his Irish heritage. He was deeply involved in the San Francisco Irish community. He was one of the founding members of the UICC and was a part of the manual workforce that went into physically building the center in the 1970s. For decades, during the St. Patrick's Day parade he loved leading the march holding the American flag followed by the gorgeous array of flags representing each of Ireland's 32 counties. Throughout the years, he spent many family vacations visiting friends and family in County Cork.

He will be forever remembered for his kindness to others, love for his family and friends, his engaging smile and his quick Irish wit. He will be greatly missed by his daughter Margaret who adored him, as well as his many nieces and nephews and friends.



IRISH HERITAGE ON DISPLAY IN THE OLD MINT BANK VAULT

The United Irish Cultural Center's Keepers of the Steps program opened their latest exhibition to great acclaim and fanfare aptly on Leap Day and on the eve of Irish American Heritage Month—February 29, 2024. The exhibit entitled, *Irish Dance—Celebrating the Roots, Rhythms, and Rituals of the San Francisco Irish* is a special collaboration with the San Francisco Historical Society and is housed in the lower level of their museum located in the original SF Mint in the heart of the Financial District. The special exhibit explores how Irish dancing has fostered community and celebrated culture since the city's inception, with stories, images, and ephemera going back to the Gold Rush days some of which are serendipitously displayed in a bank vault from that era!

The Opening Night Reception drew a healthy crowd of people both new to and familiar with Irish Dance, which is one of the goals of the program. As UICC Vice President and "Keepers" Committee Co-Chair Anne Cassidy Carew shared in her opening remarks, "San Francisco is a small city, and even smaller in the dance world. These are the stories that connect us and keep our heritage alive."

Vice Consul Jennifer Chadwick commended the group's efforts and underscored its important role in the



Irish diaspora. The Consulate, which facilitates grant applications for the Government of Ireland's Emigrant Support Programme—of which the Keepers of the Steps program is a beneficiary—remarked on the impressive rate of growth of the program. The committee attributes this to an unmet need. Organizers say, "There is very little written about the history of Irish dance, and so it is incumbent upon us to record these stories—and with a sense of urgency before stories are lost."

The keynote was an animated and inspired address from Captain Jack Hart of the SFPD who shared his own Irish dance story in the context of embracing his proud Irish heritage and how it has shaped his life. He

delighted the crowd with his personal accounts, a quick song reminiscent of his dancing days with the Murphy School of Irish Dance at the Ethnic Dance Festival, and concluded with a quick, and rousing step or two—spry as ever!

The evening was marked by fine entertainment from the Boyle Irish Dance Academy —instructor Noreen Boyle Heavey, TCRG is a member of the Keepers committee and brought some dancers to add to the evening along with San Francisco's newest Rose, Maggie Baglin on pipes.

The 100 gathered guests had plenty of time to take in the exhibit and view the dress collection in the old bank vault. Stories were exchanged, memories made—and shared! Irish Dance has touched so many lives over so many decades—the theme alone provides a common ground and connects us all. The committee, led by Anne Cassidy Carew and Eileen Mize, consists of Noreen Boyle, Anne Baglin, Jamie O'Keefe, Kathleen Martin McKeon, and Jennifer Drennan.

The Keepers of the Steps Exhibition will be on display at the San Francisco Historical Society Museum, 608 Commercial Street, in San Francisco's Financial District through the end of April 2024. Museum hours are Thursday–Saturday I0 am—4 pm— the historic building alone is worth a look. And while you are there, you'll find that the Irish Dance history exhibition pairs nicely with the SF Historical Society's concurrent exhibit featuring the Museum of Performance + Design's, San Francisco On Stage with historical artifacts from the SF Ballet and Opera.


