FROM THE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM ARCHIVES OF 1999, PLEASE ENJOY A HEART-FELT DESCRIPTION OF THIS SHCP SENIOR'S IRISH HERITAGE SUBMITTED TO THE UICC.

My name is Erin Gulbengay. I was born on March 2,1981 to the proud parents Kathleen (Kay) and George Gulbengay. My mother Kay (Toolis) Gulbengay is a first generation Irish American. My Grandparents, Mary and Ray Toolis landed in San Francisco in 1926 and 1929. They were raised

in Achill Island, County Mayo and lived only 5 miles from each other. It was not until a dance at the Knights of the Red Branch (KRB) that they met at 7th and Mission Streets in San Francisco. I have often heard my mother call the KRB the predecessor the United Irish Cultural Center.


I have heard remarkable stories about the generosity of my Grandparents from both my family and numerous people in the Irish Community who always remind me of my wonderful Grandparents and their involvement in the Irish Community in San Francisco. Most people who remember my Grandmother (Mary) whom I never had the pleasure of knowing, always remark about her kindness, warmness and best "The Best Irish Bread in San Francisco."

My Grandfather, (Ray) whom I did have the privilege of living with for the first five years of my life, is remembered as quiet, fun loving and generous man. Their home (which is my home) was always open to all new "Greenhorns" arriving from Ireland. According to my mother there was a preference for the Mayo people. My Grandfather was known for his efforts in assisting young Irish in finding work, and I have met many who have told me that my Grandfather found them their first job. He was an active member of the Connaught Athletic Club. HIs home was available for meetings of the Club. I am told that many a good Irish party was held at my Grandparent's home. His father Pat Toolis was President of the Mayomen's Association and was the field announcer at Ewing Field for the Gaelic Football Games.

Like my Grandparent, my parents, have been active in the Irish Community in San Francisco. They remain close to the many friends of my Grandparents of all ages and Counties of Ireland. My father, George, (although not being Irish by birth) was a Member of the UICC Board of Directors for two years and served as Vice President. My mother, Kay, was a Member of the Board of Directors for three years and served as President for two of those three years.

I am proud of my Irish Heritage. Through my Grandparents and parents example, love and involvement in the Irish Community, i see the need to continue to keep alive our Irish Heritage, as it is this heritage that joins a loving people together to remember their own roots of Ireland and share their memories and love for Ireland.

BRIAN STANNARD - MAY 16TH BOOK TALK



Alcatraz tour guide Stannard recounts the exploits of the prison's "secondmost-notorious inmate" in his immersive debut. Ray Gardner was a mail train robber who escaped prison three times in the years after WWI, earning himself regular mentions in vaudeville acts of the era and nicknames including the Smiling Bandit and the Human Eel. In reality, Gardner was an Army deserter and amateur boxer with a wife and child, whose thefts up and down the West Coast were never particularly lucrative. After Gardner broke out of Washington State's McNeil Island prison twice in the early 1920s, federal agents mounted a public campaign for information leading to his arrest, and America became enthralled

by the letters he wrote to California newspapers and President Warren Harding earnestly pleading for his conviction to be overturned. After he was caught and sent to Leavenworth and then Alcatraz, Gardner begged for a lobotomy, attributing his criminal behavior to an old head injury. Finally paroled in 1938, he published a brief memoir about his time locked up in Alcatraz with the likes of Al Capone and George "Machine Gun" Kelly, and gave several radio interviews. In 1940, Gardner died poor and alone, by suicide, at a hotel in San Francisco's Tenderloin District. Stannard's thorough research and swift pacing satisfy. Historical true crime fans should check this out.
