## **Exciting Summer Programs & Events At The Center!**

#### **Leo T Walsh Program**

PRIDE OF PLACE THIS MONTH goes to the 2024 Leo T Walsh scholarship program committee which disbursed a record \$71,000 in financial awards this year to 69 students graduating eighth grade or high school. The program has awarded a total of 739 scholarships since its start in 1994. The 2024 financial payouts to students increased by \$13,000 over last year's number, and several new awards were made this year including the Robert F Reinland and Paul T Reynolds memorial scholarships. Special thanks to the Paul Reynolds family who contributed a significant donation this year to the educational endowment fund. The success of the program is owed to the generous contributions of community supporters and donors. The organizers extend their gratitude to everyone who played a part in this year's success. Special recognition to Peggy Nevin and Carmelle Reiser for their tireless efforts behind the scenes in administering the scholarship program. More than 300 people attended the 2024 awards event on May 19.

#### **Summer Camp Kick Off**

The fourth annual summer camp begins on Monday, June 10, and runs through Friday, June 28. This year, more than 90 kids have signed up,

a significant increase from the camp's inception in 2021, when it started with just 30 kids. This rise in participation reflects the camp's growing reputation for quality programs and engaging activities. This year's camp explores the sounds and stories of Ireland's songs, singers, and vocal legends in a show production created by campers and camp staff on the final night of the show on June 28. While the camp continues to emphasize musical theatre, singing, music, dance, and hip hop, it also offers a variety of other activities. Kids can explore computer programming, web design, art, and set design, ensuring a wellrounded experience that caters to diverse interests and talents.

#### Record Three Céilís in June

We have three Céilí dances penciled in for June, which might be a record for the Center. Up first is the Mary McDonagh Tribute Céili on Sunday, June 2, 6:30pm to 9:30pm, featuring the Sourdough Céilí Band. There will be a special performance of the Rose Tree Youth Céilí Band at the beginning of the event starting around 6.25pm. Renowned Scottish accordionist Gary Blair will play for the Céilidh on Friday June 14 at 7:00pm. During the Trad Festival weekend there will be a Céilí Mór on Saturday June 22, between 6:00 to 9:00pm with

music by the Sourdough Céilí Band.

#### Bloomsday, June 15

As part of the global Bloomsday Festival for Ulysses by James Joyce, author Michael Fallon will discuss Bloomsday Eve, A Personal Reflection on Ulysses in the St Francis Room starting at 3:30pm (doors open at 3:00pm). This event is sponsored by the Dowling Library and will feature live music and refreshments.

Also on Saturday, June 15, the Center will hold a benefit concert for the Children of Gaza. Held in the Emerald Pub, Gig for Gaza will raise funds for MECA (Middle East Children's Alliance). All ages are welcome at the concert, which will feature Irish Music from 4:00pm to 10:00pm; there will also be art for sale by Gazan artists during the event.

#### Trad Fest Weekend

We will host our first annual Traditional Irish music weekend at the Center between Friday, June 21 and Sunday, June 23. Irish music session band Paddy on the Binge from Davis, CA will kick off the festival at 7.30pm on Friday evening. Harpist Amelia Romano will also perform during the

evening. On Saturday we host several Irish music workshops sponsored by the Cooley-Keegan Comhaltas branch. Live music will take place in Wawona Gates from 2:00pm to 5:00pm performed by Turf in the Bog out of Yosemite, CA. On Sunday The Gas Men perform at Wawona Gates between 2:00pm and 5:00pm with the Irish pipers and Irish dancers.

# Leo T Walsh Scholarship Program Continues To Grow

The 2024 Leo T Walsh Scholarship awards program disbursed a record \$71,000 to 69 students on Sunday, May 19, 2024, at the United Irish Cultural Center. Thirty-seven high school seniors and thirty-two eighth grade students earned a financial award for the next phase of their academic careers. The scholarship program was established in 1994, and in its first year had two recipients. Since then, 740 scholarships have been awarded over the years, with a record 69 awards this year.

Many thanks to Scholarship Co-Chairs Peggy Nevin and Carmelle Reiser for all their efforts. Thank you to all the wonderful donors and especially Tom McGarvey who has supported seventy scholarships down through the years.
