Cartoon Saloon: Irish Animation Studio Visits The Center





Sign Finds New Home

N APRIL, MIKE O'DRISCOLL VISITED the Patrick J Dowling library and bestowed upon the Irish Center a cherished relic: the Connaught Social Club sign, tucked away in his late mother Rose Driscoll's garage for years. Crafted by Larry Donnelly, Rose's brother-in-law, this sign was a staple at dances and picnics over the decades. Larry Donnelly, also known for installing the double stairs before the Irish Center's grand opening, played a significant role in its establishment. Rose O'Driscoll (nee Lennon) from Cloone, County Leitrim, and Mike's father, a native of Baltimore in west Cork, were both founding members of the Irish Center when it opened its doors on March 8th, 1975. As the Center approaches its 50th anniversary on 45th Avenue next year, this donation serves as a poignant reminder of its rich history and enduring community spirit.
