

BOARD MESSAGE

AN BHFUIL GAELIGE AGAT? DO YOU SPEAK IRISH?

Our cultural program offerings takes a significant step forward this month with the launch of a dedicated Irish-language learning program this spring.

Beginning January 24, we will offer 4 eight week long classes: a beginner class for children and three adult classes designed to meet learners at different stages - those new to the language, those with some formal Irish-language experience, and those looking to expand their fluency and conversational skills. At the conclusion of each day's formal instruction, participants will have the opportunity to practice what they've learned in an informal setting known as a Pop-up Gaeltacht, where communication through Irish is encouraged and supported.

Global Rise of Irish Traditions — This expansion comes at a time when interest in Irish arts, language, and cultural traditions is rising globally-and that is no exaggeration. The latest language statistics suggest that there are 1.7 million people worldwide actively learning Irish. The language has seen a significant resurgence, driven by cultural pride, educational reforms in Ireland, and the growth of digital learning tools.

Gaeilge is Cool — Digital apps are currently the primary method for learning Irish globally. One popular platform Duolingo has approximately 1 million people actively learning Irish at any given time. Irish is the #1 language being learned in Ireland. Since its launch, over 5 million people outside of Ireland have used the app to start learning the language. The global distribution of these learners corresponds to 36% of learners living in the USA, 23% in Ireland, and 11% in the UK.

Social media, independent tutors, TikTok and other social platforms have become major hubs for informal learning. For instance, the #Gaeilge hashtag has surpassed 120 million views on TikTok, and online educators like "Irish With Mollie" reach over 150,000 students globally.

Measuring the Growth — According to the 2022 Census in the Republic of Ireland, 1.87 million people (nearly 40% of the population) claim the ability to speak Irish, though only about 72,000 speak it daily outside the education system. In 2025, Irish was identified as the UK's second-fastest growing language to learn, with course enrollments jumping 155% over five years as people reconnect with their heritage.

Gaelscoileanna — Over 900,000 students attend English-medium elementary and high schools where Irish is a mandatory subject. Gaining popularity over the past thirty years are Irish-medium education (Gaelscoileanna) where approximately 55,787 students are educated entirely through Irish. In addition, Summer Irish Colleges or Coláistí Samhraidh are immersive learning experiences which topped 22,753 students attending officially approved summer courses in Gaeltacht areas in 2024. In Northern Ireland roughly 228,600 people (12.4% of the population) indicated having some knowledge of the language.

What We See Firsthand — We are witnessing this renewed energy in Irish arts firsthand at the Center. Over the past five years, our youth programming has seen extraordinary growth and community support. This summer, children will have the option of participating in up to six weeks of summer camp, building on the exceptional work of our Camp Director, Máire Clerkin, and her teaching staff since 2021.

Parents regularly share stories about how meaningful and enjoyable the Irish Center's summer camp experience has been for their children. These young people are being nurtured as the next great generation of Irish Americans on the West Coast.

Today's generation of children growing up in San Francisco and across the Bay Area has the unique privilege of coming of age at a time when Irish cultural and sporting activities within the Irish American community have flourished. What were once occasional or peripheral experiences are now firmly woven into weekly routines and community life.

We now see children deeply engaged in Irish arts and cultural programs at the Center - opportunities that were not always as visible or accessible in years past.

Looking Ahead —As we look ahead to continued growth and increased participation in activities that place Irish America at their heart, it is clear that we will need additional space to meet this demand. This year will be a pivotal one for the redevelopment of the Center. We ask for your continued support of the Board's efforts and of Irish Center events. The opportunity is in front of us. The train is leaving the station. The question is not whether Irish culture is thriving - it is. The question is whether you will be part of its future.

Tá an toadhcháí geal. The future is bright.




Rowdy Irish Tales For Children, Lenihan, Edmund.


No Lending/Giving Away: It's unlucky to lend money or give anything away, as it signifies giving away prosperity; keep some money in your wallet.




